



### **What You Can (and Can't) Bring Onboard – A Friendly Note on Booze**

Let's talk about the important stuff—booze, vino, bubbles, your favorite liquid courage.

Here's the deal when boarding Royal Caribbean International:

Each guest aged 21+ may bring one (1) 750ml bottle of wine or champagne onboard on embarkation day. Think of it as your personal stash of grape juice with ambition. Just make sure it's in your carry-on bag.

Now, before anyone tries to get creative:

- **✗** Beer? Not happening
- **✗** Hard liquor / spirits / "just a little something"? Also no
- **✗** Multiple bottles hidden in clever places? They've seen it all

Anything outside the one-bottle allowance may be held and returned to you at the end of the cruise.

If you decide to take your vino out on the town (i.e., into a restaurant or bar), there may be a corkage fee (around \$15). If you enjoy it in your room—no fee, no judgment.

Of course, if you'd rather skip the BYOB strategy and go full open bar lifestyle, beverage packages are available directly through the cruise line. You can explore and purchase those easily in the app—entirely your call depending on how you plan to... hydrate.
